43rd Annual SUNFAIR CROSS COUNTRY INVITATIONAL

Saturday, October 1, 2016

The 43rd annual Sunfair Invitational Cross Country Meet will be held Saturday October 1st, 2016 at Franklin Park in Yakima, Washington. Over 2000 runners are expected to descend upon Franklin Park for an exciting day of top level competition. In past years teams from British Columbia, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah and Washington have participated. The Sunfair Invitational is comprised of 16 races over the 3 mile course at Franklin Park. There is an appropriate race for every member of a team to participate in, including coaches and spectators. The highlights of the day usually occur during the 7 varsity flights, where a single varsity runner from each team (boy and girl) will compete against their counterparts from the other participating teams. The meet begins at 8:45 am with the 3rd-6th grade race and will end at 4:30 pm with the awards ceremony at the base of the terraces. The varsity flights start at 12 noon.

The Sunfair Cross Country Invitational is the largest single-day high school participation event in the Northwest. Brooks has been the major sponsor of the meet for the last seven years and will be there again this year. Brooks awards a brand new pair of running spikes to first place finishers in each of the seven varsity flights. Over 40 local businesses and individuals partner with Brooks Sports and the Eisenhower Cross Country Parents Club to help insure a fun, safe and successful event.

Meet Records: The course record for the boys is held by Matthew Davis an NCAA All American from Oregon. In 2011, Amy-Elise Neale set a new girls' course record of 17:03.9 on a day that saw 23 girls run the course in under 19 minutes. The previous record was set in 2004 by Brie Felnagle in a race where the top 2 finishers broke U.S. Olympian Sara Schwald's record: Brie Felnagle from Bellarmine Prep in 1st place and Zoe Nelson from Flathead High School in Montana in 2nd place.

The meet director for the Sunfair Cross Country Invitational is Phil English, Cross Country coach for Eisenhower High School.

Course Length:

3 miles for all races with the exception of the 3rd-6th grade (1 mile), the 7th-8th grade (1.5 miles) and the Frosh (2.0 miles) competitions. These races will be run over the last sections of the 3 mile course. For example, the Frosh races will be run over the last 2 miles of the regular 3 mile course. The 3rd-6th Grade Race starts under the tree at the 2 mile mark. The 7th-8th Grade Race starts in the Southwest corner of the park. The Frosh race uses the regular starting line and the distance is adjusted on the dogleg at the top of the terraces.

Course **Description:**

Primarily grass with short sections of pavement. Spikes or flats may be worn. The course is comprised of 3 1/2 loops with the terrain varying from a steep hill at 1 mile to rolling, gentle areas. The start area will be near the center of Franklin Park. The finish area will be near the new Rotary Pavilion. The course will be marked and available for viewing on Friday afternoon and officials will be available for course clarification from 2:00-6:00 pm. Packets can be picked up then also

Entry Form:

All High School Teams are required to enter the meet using Athletic.net. Middle School teams are also required to use Athletic.net. Students in grades 3rd-8th who have not pre-registered may register at the Rotary Pavilion on the south side of Franklin Park on Friday afternoon after 2:00PM or on Saturday morning after 7:00AM. Parents and coaches must allow ample time prior to your 3rd-8th grade race, if you elect to register on the morning of the race. Registration for the Community Fun Run is not required.

Schools are encouraged to enter runners in any and all races at Sunfair. Registration must be completed by noon on Thursday to allow us time to create the team packets and meet program. The race you choose for your runners to compete in is entirely your prerogative and can be made right up to race time but you may enter only one boy and one girl in each of the 7 varsity flights.

Lane **Assignments:**

There will be no assigned lanes. Runners are free to start at any point behind the starting line.

Meet Scoring: All seven Varsity Flights will be scored by place. The team accumulating the lowest number of points for all seven flights will be declared the winner. Ties will be broken by the finish of the runner in Flight 7. Teams that do not have seven varsity runners complete the course will be assigned the last place score for any one or more flights. Schools must have five varsity runners complete the course in order to be considered for team scoring. Only one boy and girl runner from each team will be scored in each of the varsity flights. There will be no team scoring for non-varsity races.

No High School teams or individuals will be entered on the day of the meet. Athletes in grades 3rd-8th who did not pre-register will be provided race numbers prior to the start of their races.

Packet Pickup: Packets may be picked-up at the Rotary Pavilion on the south side of Franklin Park on Friday afternoon after 2:00PM or on Saturday morning after 7:00AM.

Medical:

A team of physicians and athletic trainers will be on duty for the duration of the meet. A medical area and tent will be located at the finish area; access will be restricted to the medical staff and meet workers ONLY.

Admission:

Franklin Park will be fenced-off for the meet. Admission gates will be established at various locations around the park. Adults will be charged \$5.00 and seniors, children and students with ASB \$4.00. All participants, coaches, and school personnel will be admitted free.

Any athletes or teams caught removing fencing, or entering the meet in through

unpatroled or unsecured areas will be disqualified.

Restrooms: Locker rooms will be available at Franklin Middle School (athletes only). Public

restrooms will be open at Franklin pool. In addition, 30 portable toilets will be

available throughout the park.

Parking: Limited parking is available at Franklin Park on Tieton Dr. Additional parking

will be available at Franklin Middle School on 19th Ave. Most parking will be on the streets in the surrounding residential neighborhoods. Please do not park on private property or block driveways. Parking for buses and vans will be available at the church on the corner of Chestnut and 16th Avenue. Additional parking is available a few blocks farther away at Roosevelt Elementary school at 16th and

Summitview Avenues.

Concessions: A full concession stand will be available for the duration of the meet. There is

also a soda fountain located in the Yakima Valley Museum at the main entrance

to Franklin Park on Tieton Drive.
